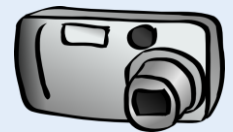

Volunteer to be a Professional Practice Experience Site!

The students in the Indiana University Health Information Management Program (Indianapolis) complete their Professional Practicum courses usually in the summer between their Junior and Senior year or during the Fall and Spring Semester of their Senior year. A Professional Practicum Experience (PPE) allows students to get hands-on practice to supplement their didactic instruction within the classroom. It can also be called an internship or externship site. Our students complete a total of 240 hours in the practicum setting and it can be completed over two semesters. The PPE site provides orientation for the students, gives them tasks to complete, and assigns them a major project that they work on throughout the semester. The projects usually involve gathering background information, doing research, developing a methodology, performing data collection, and giving recommendations based upon their results. This major project also serves as the students’ capstone, and the students present their findings at the IUPUI School of Informatics and Computing Capstone event. The Capstone event is open to the public.

The COVID-19 virus has brought challenges to many HIM and HIT programs throughout the United States. How can students still complete their practicum experience while following social distancing guidelines? Fortunately for IUPUI, the majority of our students were able to complete their projects at home in cooperation with their clinical site. They were still able to work with their clinical instructors and provided opportunities to listen to virtual meetings. Students like the in-person contact, but it prepares them for the future of telecommuting. The American Health Information Management Association also provided PPE projects that the students could work on from home.

It is very important that all HIM/HIT students get hands-on experience. It allows them to make the connection and gives them the opportunity to work with a mentor. It is important for seasoned HIM professionals to give back to our Indiana students. Students come in with a fresh perspective, provide additional insight, and help you complete a project that you haven’t been able to get to with a very busy schedule. Our students have created training materials, reviewed business associate agreements and moved them into a new contract software system, conducted audits, cleared out electronic health record work queues, and helped recoup thousands of dollars in the accounts receivable area. All of our Indiana HIM and HIT programs need clinical sites.
