IHIMA Day at the Indiana Statehouse

IHIMA hosted 'Day at the Statehouse' on Tuesday, February 25, 2020. The day started with the IHIMA Legislative Committee Chairs, Ashley Hendry, MBA, MSL, RHIA, and Bonnie Aspaizu, JD, RHIA, presenting 'What is Your Advocacy IQ?'. Defining advocacy, an overview of the federal legislative and regulatory processes, an overview of state advocacy, the HIM role in advocacy, and advocacy in action was discussed.

Andrew VanZee, V.P. of Regulatory and Operations at the Indiana Hospital Association (IHA) presented the 2020 Legislative Update. This year's legislative session is a short session that started on January 6, and by state law, will conclude on or before March 14. Short sessions, which occur in even numbered years, are non-budget years.

Lawmakers had more than 900 bills proposed this legislative session to consider, 300 of the bills passed the first half of the session. Andrew highlighted a few of the bills, i.e., surprise medical bills - HB 1004 and SB 3, all-payer claims database (APCD) – SB 4, out of pocket cost estimates – SB 3, and credentialing, billing, and employment contracts – SB 243.

Julie Halbig, JD, Consultant for IHA, spoke about what was happening at the Statehouse during this session. There was a lot going on because of this session coming to an end in just over two weeks.

Each attendee received a packet with information to help facilitate conversations with the legislators, i.e., HIM in Advocacy, the HIM Profession, medical records charging law, etc. The group had the opportunity to talk to several legislators over lunch at the Indiana Statehouse.

Lastly, the group toured the Statehouse and learned about the rich history of our state legislative system.

What Does Poor Documentation Lead To?

Incomplete documentation can lead to reduced reimbursement for providers and facilities. Incomplete documentation leaves our coders spending more time on querying providers than coding. If documentation is not complete, or lacks specificity, coders can fail to assign the proper diagnoses and procedure codes. These daily struggles lead to incomplete or inaccurate claim submission, rejected or denied claims and improper payments. In the end, providers may not be receiving the payment they deserve.

Before the Affordable Care Act (ACA) came into view in 2014 our health plans may have been a little less likely to insure those members with higher cost conditions, or chronic conditions. The ACA made it possible for them to insure high cost members by receiving a share of a risk adjustment pool. The plans with healthier members must pay into the pool, and those with higher cost members, receive payments from the pool. It's like a form of cost sharing between health plans. If documentation is lacking, health plan reimbursement and premiums could be affected.

The most important reason we need to ensure clinical documentation is complete and accurate is for quality of patient care. Incomplete or inaccurate documentation can lead to poor treatment for the patient. Documentation being shared between providers needs to tell the story of the patient from beginning to end. If documentation is inaccurate, proper care may not be provided and could result in legal actions taken against the provider or facility.

Education is key to assisting providers with complete and accurate documentation in the medical record. The result will lead to improvements in provider reimbursement, health plan success in the market, and quality care for patients. CCS & CCS-P to Launch as a Beta Exam in May

Taken from AHIMA's State Leaders and House of Delegates Engage Community: CCS & CCS-P to Launch as a Beta Exam in May Post

Please be advised, the CCS and CCS-P examinations in the USA and Canada will be launching as beta exams on May 1, 2020. A beta exam is a new version of a certification exam consisting of new questions that have not yet undergone psychometric analysis for validity and reliability. The new CCS and CCS-P exams are the result of recent job analyses to ensure the exams are relevant and reflect current practice. The new content outlines are posted at ahima.org/certification/CCS and ahima.org/certification/ccsp under "Exam Prep."

During the beta exam period immediate scoring is not available. Scores are dependent on enough people taking the beta exam. Therefore, scores may take up to 24 weeks following the launch of the beta exam. The more test takers participate in the beta exam period, the faster the exam cut score will be determined and scores can be provided.

Changes to CCHIIM Domains

Taken from AHIMA's weekly E-Alert for February 6, 2020:

In 2019, CCHIIM's (Commission for Certification of Health Informatics and Information Management's) Recertification workgroup spent time considering and updating the HIIM domains in the recertification guidelines. The aim was to update the HIIM domains to reflect current and future workforce competencies and incorporate those changes in the 2020 recertification guidelines. The 2020 HIIM domain headers are:

- Informatics, Analytics and Data Use
- Organizational Management and Leadership
- Data Structure, Content and Information Governance
- Revenue Cycle Management
- Health Law and Compliance
- Clinical Foundations
- Information Protection: Access, Disclosure, Archival, Privacy and Security
- Evolving Topics
- Other

To better understand how the 2019 domains map to the 2020 Recertification Guide, a 2020 Domain Name Crosswalk has been developed to aid members in selecting the correct domain category within the CEU Center. The detailed descriptions for each HIIM domain can be found in both the Recertification Guide and the CEU Center. New domains are effective as of January 1, 2020.
