## Q&A WITH JAMEY

#### What motivated you to join IHIMA's Board of Directors?

 I'm passionate about our profession and wanted to find a way to give back. Serving on the Board also helps me stay up to date on HIM topics that I may not encounter in my day to day role as a Coding/CDI Director.

### Could you briefly describe your primary roles and responsibilities as a board member?

• In the President-Elect role, I'm responsible for working closely with our President and other Board Members to ensure continuity of IHIMA's strategic goals.I'm also responsible for coordination of IHIMA awarded

scholarships to our Indiana CAHIIM accredited programs. What specific initiatives or projects have you been involved in as a board member, and how have they contributed to IHIMA's goals?

 Each year, the board discusses and outlines topics that we will focus on from an educational standpoint as part of our strategic plan. When I was the Professional Development Chair, it was rewarding to know that we recruited speakers and topics for our members that aligned with the strategic plan.

## Board service often comes with challenges. Could you describe a challenge you've faced and how you and the board addressed it?

 One of challenges we face is recruiting new faces on the board and that is something we are actively working on. Hence, the purpose of you reading this! A lot of the reason I didn't volunteer before is because I was intimidated. Maybe how you are feeling no? Like how can I contribute or when do I have time? Refer to the next question for answers :)

### What advice would you give to someone considering joining IHIMA's Board of Directors?

• Just do it. My hesitation was always that I wasn't confident enough in myself nor did I think I had time for it. If not me, then who's going to do it is what finally convinced me. It doesn't matter your current role, nor your previous work experience, how much you know or don't know, you can make a difference.You are part of a bigger team so just know, you wouldn't be working alone. As it relates to time... let's be real... I didn't join because I was filling my time eating bon-bons and watching the latest reality shows and needed something additional to fill my time up with. I did it because I asked again, if not me, then who? The time commitment does depend on the role, but again, we all support one another. I make the time and when I need help, I ask for it. When I've been asked about time, I can't always quantify it because sometimes I'll just call another board member as a friend and end up talking about board related things because we share that passion with one another.

How has your board experience shaped your view of the health information management field and its impact on healthcare?

 I'm in a Coding/CDI Director role so my day job is somewhat limiting on what is going on outside of that. The board has allowed me to stay in the know and up to date on other hot topics within HIM. I'm sure I'm not the only one that feels like I can't give an easy answer to what our profession does. Our skills and expertise allow us to have an impact on healthcare beyond the traditional roles.
