ROLE OVERVIEW

- Annual Financial Report: Each year, the Treasurer presents an annual financial report at the IHIMA annual meeting, offering members an overview of the organization's financial health.

As Treasurer, you play a significant role in various committees, contributing to IHIMA's financial and operational success. Your committee responsibilities include:

Q&A WITH DEB

What motivated you to join IHIMA's Board of Directors?
